Course Description

OCD, ODD, Conduct Disorder, Bipolar, Depression: These are common psychiatric disorders in school age children. There are children of every age, in every school, with one or more of these disorders. This course will provide all education professionals with the information needed to promote a successful academic and social environment for the student with a mental illness. Learn the warning signs, diagnostic criteria, treatment options, classroom interventions, social and academic pressures, as well as how to assist and support the family of a child with a psychiatric disorder.

Methods of Instruction

This course will explore common childhood psychiatric disorders such as OCD, ODD, conduct disorder, bipolar and depression. It will provide an understanding of the symptoms, diagnosis, etiology, treatment, classroom strategies and interventions and academic and social pressures experienced by the student with a mental illness through reading assignments, viewing media, critiquing assessment tools and thought provoking discussions. Students will demonstrate their understanding, knowledge and ability to accommodate children and adolescents with psychiatric disorders using specific techniques, instructional strategies and classroom modifications.

Students will connect with each other throughout the course within forums and various other types of online feedback options built into each class.

Methods of Assessment

In order to earn an A in the class, a student must complete all of the assigned readings and assignments as well as submit two papers: 1. Comparing and contrasting the common psychiatric disorders in school age children, including etiology, symptoms and behaviors, treatment, educational implications, instructional strategies and classroom accommodations. 2. Demonstrating the ability to accommodate such students using specific techniques, instructional strategies and classroom modifications.

In order to earn a B in class, a student must complete all of the readings and assignments listed above in addition to submitting one of the two papers described above.

Instructors are online each day of the course and correspond with students through the course itself, feedback on assignments, e-mail, and by phone.
