Course Description

Today many teachers and support staff from every grade and content level are worried about the state of discipline within our schools and society. There are many students who are willing to do less, even as more is expected of teachers, poor behavioral issues, academic dishonesty, and challenges with some parents who do not always agree with educators during difficult classroom/school situations. Times have changed, as some students have the expectation that they are socially promoted from one grade to the next with a limited understanding of the instruction that has been presented to them. There are teachers across this nation are under immense pressure, as they handle a myriad of responsibilities from instructing K-12, coaching, club advisors, and various activities, as they endure the strains of this rewarding, but this challenging profession. The class will delve into educational rigors that place pressures on teachers across this nation. We will look at the beliefs of some students who are not willing to do their best, adhere to school rules, and demonstrate a sense of entitlement. *Discipline in our Schools* is a powerful look at education today, the struggles of teachers, complex situations, and important ways to handle these hard times for all teachers. There will be forums, films, documentaries, news footage, stories, and national educational statistics that will reinforce the need to support all educators!!!

Course Goals

Methods of Instruction

The students will have different types of assignments that are based on readings, forums, written responses, think tank research, news footage, film clips, speeches, and movies that will be presented to this class. Within these different types of assignments, the students are expected to answer questions, write responses, respond to different students, and utilize their experience as educators, parents, and citizens to complete this work.

Students will connect with each other throughout the course within forums and various other types of online feedback options built into each class.

Methods of Assessment

The students will have a variety of different assignments that are expected to be completed daily during the course. All graduate students will complete a paper or lesson plan that includes materials and resources that focuses on the content, issues, and the key points that were addressed in this class.

Instructors are online each day of the course and correspond with students through the course itself, feedback on assignments, and e-mail.

The growth of student entitlement within our K-12 grades reading and study that will be answered by the students on the fear by many educators that students are not being held accountable.	2.50
Early attempts by school districts to recently call for greater rules and even bans against the presence of cell phones in schools. The students will look at this immense problem of technology through a reading and an interview of one district on proposed phone limitations.	2.50
Through a study, students will examine and answer questions on the connection and reality of using basic principals today to possibly change some of the concerns that are facing educators today in our schools.	2.50
Movie assignment that is based on the content, themes, and direction of this course. There will be several different movie choices that will have questions, research stories, video links that may be tied to this film. Only one choice needs to be completed and the assignment is to be submitted with this film choice.	4.00
The students will analyze a current study on the ongoing concerns of COVID and our students abilities to educationally move beyond this pandemic. There will be questions that will be answered on the present problems that are still facing educators over COVID.	3.00
The class will watch a video on Bill Gates and his views of work ethic, goals, and the direction of this nation with our younger students. They will answer questions that are based on this extremely well-known business and technology figure.	3.00
There will be a study on the most pressing problems that are facing schools and educators and questions will be answered on these major concerns.	2.50
A PBS study on greater student discipline in this nation in our schools and the connection of better student discipline, responsibilities, and pride in their studies will be presented within this assignment. Students will answer questions based on the views of specialists and educators on this pressing concern.	3.00
A video will be watched on the rise of juvenile delinquents that are widely being incarcerated in this nation. The students will will watch this video, answer questions, and research a local juvenile delinquent center that is near their home/school.	3.00
